### What's New

#### Polynesia starts centenary events

The launch of centenary celebrations at the capital of French Polynesia was a grand gathering on 12 May of over 200 Scouts and leaders together with government and local dignitaries. Some 60 years ago, the first Scout camp of French Polynesia was held on that very spot at the Radisson Plaza Resort in Tahiti. The centenary gathering became a memorable reunion for Scout leaders who attended the first camp.

The Minister of Youth, Mr Clarentz Vernaudon, and the Minister of Culture, Ms. Natacha Taurua graced the event. The youth minister who was a Scout himself assured government support for Polynesian Scouts attending the World Jamboree in UK in July 2007 and for the growth of Scouting in Polynesia.

Regional Director Abdullah Rasheed who was present highlighted the relevance of the 100 years of Scouting. The Scout Council has planned a full range of activities for the entire centenary year. As a sunrise event, there will be a Rover expedition to the three highest peaks in Papeete on the 1st of August.

#### National Rover Council organizes youth wing

French Polynesia is embarking on expanding its leadership base by organizing the youth wing of the Scout Council with a team of 6 young adult members. Leading the group is the chairperson, Ms. Maeva, a full-fledged voting member representing the young adult members in the board. Youth members are expected to formulate their action plan and strategies for the future of the youth wing, with two adult members supporting them.

#### Scouts of the World Workshop

World Scout Bureau organized for the first time the Scouts of the World Workshop on 28-31 May 2007 at the Vajiravudh Scout Camp in Thailand. The aim of the workshop is to share with National Scout Organizations the technical process of developing the Scouts of the World programme as a way of revitalizing the Senior and Rover sections for 15 to 26 year-old members. Countries represented were Bhutan, Republic of China, Hong Kong, India, Indonesia, Japan, Korea, Malaysia, Philippines, Singapore, Sri Lanka and Thailand for a total of 41 participants including 20 local and 21 from overseas.

The workshop explained the concept of the Scouts of the World Programme and its elements such as the Scouts of the World Award, Scouts of the World Discovery, Scouts of the World Voluntary Service, Scouts of the World Partnership, and support structures. Supporting the workshop were APR Programme Sub-Committee chairman Mari Nakano, Sub-Committee member Julie Creed, APR Committee Chairman Eric Khoo, Regional Director Abdullah Rasheed and World Scout Bureau executives Andres Morales, Syd Castillo and Myrna Calderon.

## **Korea hosts International Agoonoree 2007**

Korea Scout Association (KSA) has been organizing Agoonorees alternately with the Girl Scouts on a yearly basis. For the centenary year and in conjunction with the 23<sup>rd</sup> Agoonoree, KSA initiated the agoonoree for international participation and had five other countries joining them, i.e. Republic of China, Malaysia, Hong Kong, Japan, Pakistan, and the Asia Pacific Regional Office. The Agoonoree was held at the beautiful island of Jeju on 24-27 May.

Participants were young girls and boys having various special needs, either mentally or physically. Programs onsite and offsite were designed for their mental and physical abilities as well as to their creativity and enthusiasm. Onsite activities were textile printing, necklace crafting, wood bug crafting, survival shooting, among others. Offsite activities were educational visits to Jeju, known as an island of antiquity, in their well-preserved folklore museums and nature parks.

Activities offered the young participants the experience of Scouting and more importantly, the caring of Scout leaders. President of KSA Mr Lee Won Hee thanked the organizers and leaders for their passion and courage and wished the young participants health and happiness.

## **Singapore Scouts in riverbank and waterways cleanup**

In line with the long-term strategic direction of the Singapore Scout Association (SSA), the Northeast Area under the leadership of Assistant Chief Commissioner Tan Tek Tin has adopted Sungei Punggol as a strategic partner of PUB (the national water agency) under *Our Waters* programme.

Launched by Dr Lam Pin Min, the adoption aims to create an impact on the importance of valuing our waters by keeping the waterways and water catchments clean. More than 300 Scouts participated in the launching. They were involved in the riverbank cleanup, waterway cleanup and house to house visit to conduct public education on water saving kits.

Sungei Punggol has been chosen because it lies within the boundary of the Northeast Area of SSA. The river is in close proximity to 48 primary and secondary schools with Scout Groups. The project will eventually involve some 1,500 Scouts. During the period of adoption, the Scouts will visit the river regularly for cleanup activities.

## **National Council Meeting honours Commissioners and Scoutmasters**

On 23-25 May, Boy Scouts of the Philippines (BSP) gathered over 500 key Scouts leaders for the 51<sup>st</sup> Annual National Council Meeting held in Palo, Leyte. This is a gathering of Council Chairmen, Council Commissioners and Council Scout Executives from the 109 councils of BSP. On this occasion, BSP National President Jejomar Binay invested the widely popular Vice-President of the Philippines, Mr Noli de Castro, as a Scout. The vice-president took the Scout oath in uniform.

As an integral part of the Annual National Council Meeting, three major awards were given to men and women for their exceptional services to Scouting. These are Outstanding Council Chairmen, Outstanding Council Scout Commissioners, and Tribute to Scoutmasters.

Regional Director Abdullah Rasheed gave the keynote message for the Tribute to Scoutmasters where he cited that volunteerism particularly at the unit level is a core business of Scouting and stressed its direct and pivotal role in the growth of the movement.

Local government officials including the provincial governor, congressional representative and city mayor fully supported the council meeting.

### **Scout Leaders in Cambodia trained**

As part of leadership capacity building for the National Association of Cambodian Scouts (NACS), 52 senior government officials from the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sports in the 24 provinces took part in the Basic Training Course for Unit Leaders in Phnom Penh. They also had an overnight camp and hiking at the wildlife centre 40 km away from Phnom Penh.

The Chief Commissioner who is the undersecretary of Ministry of Education was the Chief Guest. Overseas trainers were Sommart Sungkapun and Dr Amnat Changrien from Thailand, Shymal Kumar Karak from India, Florencio Atinyao from BSP who is the APR executive attache, and Thian Hiong-Boon from the APR Office and Sok Seng Yan of NACS.

On 28 May, NACS leaders were appointed to the Scout Executive Committee and its branches in provinces and cities. The Deputy Prime Minister presided the oath taking ceremony together with the Minister of Council of Ministers, cabinet members, diplomatic corps and the media.

### **New leadership in Scouts of China**

The National Council of Scouts of China in Taiwan elected Dr Chao Shou-Po as the new Chairman (Chief Commissioner) of the General Association of Scouts of China for the term of 2007-2010, effective from 10 May 2007.

Dr. Chao, Shou-Po is a very prominent public figure in Taiwan, having held governmental positions including Labor Minister, Secretary-General of the Cabinet, Minister without Portfolio and Governor of the Province of Taiwan. Recently he was the Board Chairman of the Broadcasting Corporation of China.

Dr. Chao has been very active in Scouting for more than three decades and was awarded the Bronze Wolf in 2004 by the World Organization of the Scout Movement.

## What's Ongoing

### SAF Scout Friendship Camp

Pakistan Boy Scouts Association is hosting the 5<sup>th</sup> SAF Scout Friendship Camp on 4-10 June in Ghora, Gali. In the last five years, hosting the SAF camp has rotated in South Asian countries, such as in Bhutan in 2002, Maldives in 2003, Nepal in 2005, and Sri Lanka in 2006. With the yearly support from the South Asia Foundation (SAF), over 150 overseas Scouts, both girls and boys, will participate in the camp this year. They are from Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Maldives, Nepal and Sri Lanka. Purpose of the camp is cultural sharing and goodwill, as well as developing tolerance and cooperation. As in all SAF Camps, Chief Commissioners from the SAARC area will have a one-day meeting on how to mutually support Scouting in South Asia. The next SAF Camp in 2008 will be in Bangladesh.

### Unit Leaders Roundtable in the Philippines

Around ten countries, i.e. Hong Kong, Malaysia, Indonesia, Bhutan, Japan, Korea, Pakistan, Maldives, Sri Lanka and the Philippines will be represented at the APR Unit Leaders Roundtable. Boy Scouts of the Philippines will host 15 participants from 10 countries and 20 local participants on 5-8 June in Tarlac City.

### World Scout Bureau BoD Meeting

A Board of Directors (BoD) meeting will take place in Geneva on 11-15 June. The BoD meeting is comprised of the Secretary General, Deputy Secretary General, six Regional Directors with the special participation of key staff members of the World Scout Bureau Central Office.

### Commemorative Stamp

The World Organization of the Scout Movement Asia Pacific Region is producing two kinds of stamps to commemorate 100 Years of Scouting. In agreement with the Philippine postal office, official date of issue is on the 1<sup>st</sup> of August 2007. For first day cover, 2000 pieces will be produced.

Sri Lanka Scouts Association has issued their centenary stamp and first day cover on the 26<sup>th</sup> of May. In addition, they produced the Sinhalese version of the centenary badge "One World One Promise".

### APR Management Meeting in Manila

A management meeting of World Scout Bureau Asia Pacific Region executives is set on 3-5 July in Manila. Attending the meeting are

Regional Scout Committee Chairman Eric Khoo and sub-committee chairmen of management and financial resources. Luc Panissod from World Scout Bureau Geneva and APRSC Vice-Chairman Zainal Abidin will also be present.

### **Ticket to Life Evaluation**

To evaluate the Ticket to Life (TTL) project six months after the first workshop was organized in December 2006, a follow-up Evaluation Workshop will be held on 8-11 July 2007 as a planning exercise for the third phase of the project. The Bharat Scouts & Guides will host the workshop at their national office in Delhi, India. TTL Coordinators as well as unit leaders helping in the project have been invited. TTL has six pilot countries, i.e. Bangladesh, India, Indonesia, Nepal, Philippines and Sri Lanka, where Scout units for street children have been formed.

### **World Scout Jamboree in UK: Participation Update**

All 23 member countries and two associate members are participating in the World Scout Jamboree in the UK from 27 July to 7 August. As of 31 May, over 6600 young people, troop leaders, contingent staff, IST and Operation One World participants. The largest contingents will come from Japan with over 1500, India with over 1000, Republic of China with over 900, Hong Kong with over 600, and Korea with over 500.
