### What's New

#### 2007 Badge in Different Languages

More national versions of the 2007 badge are coming up joining the Japanese, Korean, Chinese, Filipino and Bahasa (Malaysia, Indonesia, Brunei Darussalam). The new additions are in Bengali (Bangladesh), Hindi (India), Dhivehi (Maldives) and Nepali – all proclaiming the theme *One World One Promise*.

#### Cambodian Scouts set wider goals

Scouting has existed in Cambodia since 1934 and was dissolved and merged with another youth organization in 1964. With changes in the political system, Scouting gradually re-established and Scout groups were organized in refugee camps at the Thai border. It was in 1994 that the World Scout Bureau started paying close attention to Cambodia and initiated contacts with relevant government ministries and Scout groups. This led to the formation of the national council and national executive board in September 2005. The AGM held in April 2006 approved the constitution and by-laws and assumed the official name *National Association of Cambodian Scouts* (NACS).

In mid February this year, Regional Director Abdullah Rasheed met key members of the Executive Committee and the Chief Commissioner to ascertain their readiness and to discuss with them their bid to join world Scouting. NACS' goal is to be a part of world Scouting after satisfying constitutional requirements and processes for membership. To support NACS in considerable ways, the Asia Pacific office deputed a senior executive from Boy Scouts of the Philippines, Mr Florencio Atinyao, to strengthen the primary structures and Scouting program for six months. This is made possible with the support of Scouts Canada. A Basic Training Unit Leader Trainers is set for May funded by Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) and an Angkor Wat Invitational Programme is planned for December this year. NACS temporarily holds office at the UNESCO building in Phnom Penh.

## **Bhutan holds first national Jamboree**

Bhutan Scouts Association (BSA) held its first National Scout Jamboree in Dhampu, Tsirang Province on 29 January to 11 February 2007. Around 500 young people, both boys and girls, joined and enjoyed the varied activities. At the Jamboree closing, the President of the Scout Council and Minister of Education, presented prestigious Long Service award to local and overseas Scout leaders who built the foundation of Scouting in Bhutan and make it an important organization as it is today.

The new Director of Bhutan's Youth Department of the Education Ministry, Mr Sonam Tabgay Dorji, visited the site of the proposed BSA Training Centre, a site allocated by the ministry for Scouts. German architect Mr Hartmut Keyler, former member of the World Scout Committee, proposed a design for the centre.

Representatives from Danish Scout and Guide Association, while attending the Jamboree, planned a summer Rover exchange programme as part of the partnership project between Bhutanese and Danish Scouts.

## **Japan assists flood victims in Jakarta**

The Scout Association of Japan (SAJ) is usually one of the first to offer a helping hand when disaster strikes. Through the National Secretary, Mr Shoji Kanai, SAJ expressed distress over the casualties and heavy damages caused by the flood that hit Jakarta on 5 February. In a spirit of fraternity, SAJ offered US\$3,000 to help mobilize Indonesian Scouts in their recovery projects for the victims.

## **New Leaders in Pakistan attend Camporee**

On Founder's Day, 22 February, the new Chief Commissioner of Pakistan Boy Scouts Association joined over 600 young people in a 3-day camporee held in Islamabad. The new chief, Lt. Gen. (ret) Javed Ashraf, is the Federal Minister of Education. Accompanying him was the Senior Deputy Chief Minister Syed Parvaiz Ali Shah Jillani and Regional Director Abdullah Rasheed.

Camporee participants joined environmental and community activities such as tree plantation, hospital visits and traffic control. For the centenary of Scouting, there are 13 wide ranging activities planned in every part of Pakistan. September will highlight the Centenary Jamboree in Islamabad. With the support of the Asia Pacific Region, Pakistan will organize the SAF Scout Camp, Programme Development Workshop, and a National Strategic Plan Review Workshop – all happening this year.

## **First Joint Partnership Visit to India**

WAGGGS and WOSM Regional Committees initiated to take partnership visits to Scouts And Guides National Organizations (SAGNO). WAGGGS has been organizing partnership visits to their member organizations once every three years since 1999. SAGNOs are organizations having both Scouts and Guides as members and the two SAGNOs in the region are Bharat Scouts & Guides (BSG)/India and Nepal Scouts.

The first joint visit took place in India on 26 February. There were 25 members of BSG Executive Committee with Abdullah Rasheed and Thian Hiong Boon representing WOSM, Regional Executive Kar Mei Lee of WAGGGS and BSG National Commissioner L.M. Jain.

The partnership visit is to have a mutual understanding between the region and the NSO on achievements, progress and best practices of member countries in relation to strategic priorities.

## Scouts give highest honors to Indonesian President and Malaysian Prime Minister

On Founder's Day in Jakarta, the Chairman of Gerakan Pramuka, Prof. Azrul Azwar, honoured Indonesian President Susilo Bambang Yudhoyono with the highest award *Lencana Tunas Kencana* as the Chief Scout of Indonesia and Malaysian Prime Minister Abdullah Badawi as Chief Scout of Malaysia. Not more than 20 persons have received the medal, which was earlier received by the Founder of Gerakan Pramuka, Sri Sultan Hamengku Buwono IX, Indonesian First President Soekarno, and Indonesian Second President Soeharto.

President Yudhoyono said that through the founder's (Baden Powell) innovative idea, the Scout movement spread all over in the world, including Indonesia since 1912. Both Yudhoyono and Badawi praised the movement through its 100 years, which is going stronger and bigger. Around a thousand Scouts and Scout leaders from Indonesia and Malaysia joined the celebration. Three members of the Asia-Pacific Region Radzwan Hussain (Malaysia), Adi Pamungkas and Brata Tryana (Indonesia) were also present. – *By Berthold Sinaulan, Asst National Commissioner for PR, Indonesia*

## Baden Powell Peak Ambassadors

With the regional circular requesting National Scout Organizations (NSO) to appoint their ambassadors for the Baden Powell Scout Peak Climb and Trail in Nepal, nominations have been received from Scouts of China, the Scout Association of Hong Kong, the Bharat Scouts & Guides/India and The Singapore Scout Association. More nominations from NSOs are expected in the coming days.

## Training Course for Chinese Speaking Countries

As a step closer to restructuring the training system of Scouts of China, the association organized the Course for Leader Trainers for Chinese-speaking countries. This was held in Taichung City, Taiwan on 5-11 February. There were 50 local participants, four from Hong Kong and one from Macau. Course Leader Chen Huang Ran, Deputy Secretary General of Scouts of China, led a 14-member local team and an international team - John De Guzman of the Philippines and Thian Hiong-Boon of APR office. Dr George Huang, Secretary General of Scouts of China, gave his encouraging support towards training development.

## Annual Rover Crew Leaders Conference

Scouts of China had the Annual Rover Crew Leaders Conference on 9 -13 February at the Feng-Chia University to celebrate the 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the university's Rover Crew. Two Rover Crew leaders from Korea joined around 120 Rover Crew leaders from universities and communities. The conference discussed strategies to sustain and market the Rover section and to enhance the spirit of Rovering.

## Nepal creates communication centre and supply service

Since June 2006, Nepal Scouts has been creating a communication and documentation center at its headquarters to preserve Scouting literatures, archives and other historical materials. A Scout supply center is planned to be completed by July 2007.

Nepal Scouts is also preparing to host the 6<sup>th</sup> APR Leaders Summit in 2008 and is considering Shankar Hotel as venue for the meeting and accommodations. The summit is a gathering of key leaders of National Scout Organizations in the region held a year before every regional conference.

### Rover Peace Baton reaches Manila

After traveling approximately 40,000 kms following three major routes covering 23 countries in the Asia Pacific Region, the 3 parts of the peace baton have finally reached Manila and will be joined as a single and unified baton at a large ceremony on 10 March. More than 6,000 Scouts and national dignitaries will join the handover. Overseas representatives will come from Bangladesh, Papua New Guinea, India, Sri Lanka, Maldives, Indonesia, as well as key leaders of the Asia Pacific Region. At the same, 500 Rovers will camp for two days at the grounds of Boy Scouts of the Philippines. Over 200,000 people and seven heads of state joined the relay with the message of peace.

### Best Scout photos for 2007 pre-selected

This year's Scout photo contest collected 294 entries from many enthusiastic photographers in 10 countries, i.e. Australia, Bangladesh, Republic of China, Hong Kong, India, Maldives, Mongolia, New Zealand, and Philippines.
