2008 is "Year of the Scout" in Australia

The Prime Minister of Australia announced that 2008 will be known as "The Year of the Scout". 2008 is the Centenary of Scouting in Australia. This is a very significant recognition by the Australian Government of the Movement not only in Australia but also internationally. This is only the 4th time in the history of Australian Federation (1901) that the Australian Government has declared a year such as this.

In addition to the above declaration the Australian Government will be releasing a circulatory \$A1 coin for 2008 as well as a series of commemorative coins for sale. There will also be a series of Australian stamps commemorating 2008 and the Australian Bureau of Statistics have indicated that they will include a Scouting image on the cover of the 2008 Year Book as well as a feature item in the book on Scouting.

Result of NSO Survey on APR Services

Twenty-four out of 25 NSOs in the region or 96% responded to the survey recently circulated by the regional office. A summary of the interpretation of qualitative data was provided by Dr Evelina Vicencio, as follows:

- *Highly Remarkable*: Personal contact maintained by executives and the Regional Director
- *Above Expectations*: Support to NSOs (regular contact with NSOs, assistance to NSOs to participate in regional events, visit to NSOs, meeting deadlines, content of regional events/summit/workshop)
- *Above expectations*: Staff Services (professional and technical knowledge of staff, staff Scouting spirit, availability of staff support in the country, quality of staff support, visibility of regional staff at national events, correspondence and feedback from regional office)
- *Above expectations*: Communications (APR inbox, Monthly Report, APR website, APR posters, APR wall calendars, CD insights, APR Directory, hard copies of reports, electronic copies of reports, timely delivery of publications)
- *Above expectations*: Relations with Committee and Sub-Committees
- *Above expectations*: New Initiatives (develop Scouting in the region, make regional events more productive)
- *Satisfactory*: Funding to NSOs through partnerships, support to NSOs through the APR Foundation, support to NSOs on new projects
- *Unsatisfactory*: None

APR Unit Leaders Roundtable

Scout leaders at the unit level have a pivotal role in the actual demonstration of Scouting's educational objectives. Twenty-nine Unit Leaders from 11 countries shared ideas on youth programme and identified strategies for its improvement as well as formulated a criteria for a model Scout unit. Participating countries were Bhutan, Hong Kong, Indonesia, Japan, Korea, Malaysia, Maldives, Philippines, Sri Lanka and Thailand. Boy Scouts of the Philippines hosted the Roundtable on 5-8 June in Tarlac City. Participants recommended for the conduct of the roundtable on a regular basis. This has been the third regional roundtable in six years, the first one was in Hong Kong in 2001, followed by Bangladesh in 2004.

SAF Scout Friendship Camp

Pakistan Boy Scouts Association hosted the 5th SAF Scout Friendship Camp on 4-10 June in Ghora, Gali. With the annual support from the South Asia Foundation (SAF), over 150 overseas Scouts, both girls and boys, participated. They are from Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Maldives, Nepal and Sri Lanka. The camp is for cultural sharing and goodwill, and for developing tolerance and cooperation amongst countries in South Asia.

During the camp, Pakistan's Federal Minister of Education and Chief Commissioner, Lt Gen Javed Ashraf, presided the gathering of Chief Commissioners from Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Bhutan, Nepal and Sri Lanka. Deputy Chief Commissioner Syed Parvaiz Jillani and Regional Director Abdullah Rasheed attended both the gathering and the camp.

The camp is hosted on rotation basis around the South Asian countries starting with Bhutan in 2002, Maldives in 2003, Nepal in 2005, and Sri Lanka in 2006. Bangladesh will take its turn to host in 2008.

World Scout Bureau BoD Meeting

Board of Directors (BoD) of the World Scout Bureau (WSB) met in Geneva on 11-15 June. BoD is comprised of the Secretary General, Deputy Secretary General, six Regional Directors with the special participation of key staff members of the WSB Central Office. Among other things, the BoD discussed the Yearly Operational Plan of WSB, centenary events, World Scout Jamboree, branding and communications, IT strategy in WSB, resource mobilization, external relations, regional initiatives, and constitutional issues.

Rover Peace Baton replica coming out soon!

A souvenir replica of the widely popular APR Rover Peace Baton will soon be issued, in limited number, as a fundraising campaign for the APR Scout Foundation. The replica would cost US\$25 each and be put on sale at the APR Scout Conference in Tokyo. Orders could be placed as early as now through the Asia Pacific Regional Office. The actual peace baton, which is 1-meter long, will be displayed at the World Scout Center at the Jamboree in UK.

Ticket to Life Planning and Evaluation Workshop

The Bharat Scouts and Guides will host the workshop at the NHQ in New Delhi on 8-11 July 2007. Ticket to Life (TTL) is a project for street children using the Scouting way. Participants are comprised of TTL coordinators and unit leaders from NSOs actively implementing activities for street children in pilot countries. These countries are Bangladesh, India, Indonesia, Nepal, Sri Lanka, Philippines, Thailand, and Pakistan, with special participation from Egypt and executives from the Asia Pacific Regional office. This workshop is a follow-up of the past six months after the introductory workshop in December 2006 and will set up a plan for the final phase of the project.

World Scout Jamboree Participation Update

All National Scout Organizations in the region are participating in the 21st World Scout Jamboree in UK from 27 July to 8 August 2007. Here's the latest on participation from APR which includes youth participants, troop leaders, contingent staff and International Service Staff: Australia 168, Bangladesh 152, Bhutan 9, Brunei Darussalam 6, Scouts of China 565, Fiji 10, Hong Kong 672, India 1235, Indonesia 331, Japan 1530, Kiribati 3, Korea 436, Malaysia 150, Maldives 6, Mongolia 18, Nepal 95, New Zealand 91, Pakistan 126, Papua New Guinea 10, Philippines 99, Singapore 62, Sri Lanka 135, Thailand 131, French Polynesia 71, Macau 8. Regional total is 6119.

World Scout Chairman to honour Baden Powell Scout Peak Expedition

World Scout Committee Chairman Herman Hui will send off participants who are heading for the Baden Powell trek and trail expedition on the 4th of September. Before send off, the chairman and regional leaders will have a mountain flight over the Himalayas including Mount Everest.

To date, eight countries have signed up for the climb and trek from 28 August to 16 September 2007. These are Taiwan (7), Korea (9), Singapore (12), Indonesia (1), Malaysia (1), Australia (2), Sri Lanka (1), USA (2) for a total of 35. Members of the Asia Pacific Evergreen Scouts (APES) and the APR Top Achiever Scouts (ATAS) are planning to attend.
